OPENING OF THE NEW EMERGENCY SERVICES DISPLAY

In December 2004, the Department of Emergency Services commenced upgrading their display at the Australian Workers Heritage Centre. ‘TREE OF KNOWLEDGE’ TREE PLANTING CEREMONY AT AUSTRALIAN WORKERS HERITAGE CENTRE

The ALP’s famed Tree of Knowledge in the main street of Barcaldine will live on through an offspring that has been successfully cultivated by the Department of Primary Industries and Fisheries. The tree – a ghost gum that is more than 160 years old – has important historical significance for the ALP, the trade union movement and the workers of Queensland. Like all living things the tree has suffered from the rigours of advancing years. The new tree has been grown from a cutting taken by Department of Primary Industries and Fisheries.

The tree was the meeting place for shearers during the Great Shearers Strike of 1891 – an event that led directly to the birth of the Australian Labor Party.

The tree can live on through its offspring, which will be planted at the Australian Workers Heritage Centre. On Monday 2nd May, a large gathering of people will be attendance for this symbolic event.

LABOR HOUSE

The first principal's residence was built in 1913 and restored to its former glory when the Australian Workers Heritage Centre purchased and refurbished the building at a substantial cost. The house to be renamed Labor House will consist of Labor memorabilia and history, the Workers Wall and Freedoms on the Wallaby (formerly displayed in the Women in War building). During the Labor Day weekend, Milton Dick, State Secretary - Australian Labor Party, will officially launch 'Labor House'. MAIN ROADS AND QUEENSLAND RAIL DISPLAY

Connecting communities.....

This stand-alone building will now house the Australia Post display. A much bigger space it will allow for those items in storage, to be dusted off and displayed for the avid viewer. WANPA-RDA MATILDA OUTBACK EDUCATION CENTRE

The Wanpa-rda Matilda Outback Education Centre continues to provide visiting students the opportunity to explore and experience Central West Queensland. These experiences complement the outstanding service that teachers and support staff provide in the classroom environment. Only until students witness and interact first hand with the outback do they truly appreciate the uniqueness of it.

A deed of agreement had existed between the Australian Workers Heritage Centre and Education Queensland, the essence of which was the granting to the Centre of a full time Education Officer. In February this year the Department of Education after considerable discussions and submissions, renewed the deed of agreement for a further three years. Ms Anna Barrett who has provided teacher relief for the last six months at the centre has now been appointed as the permanent full time Education Officer. The Wanpa-rda Matilda Centre has many projects planned for the next three years from implementation of a new curriculum to refurbishment and further promotion of the centre. We look forward to these exciting projects.

The Wanpa-rda Matilda Centre has applied for funding through the Jupiter's Casino Community Benefit Fund to convert the previous 'Senior Citizens Building' on site into a multi-purpose facility. The facility will be used for conferences and functions and will double as a recreation room for students staying at Wanpa-rda Matilda Outback Education Centre. The approximate cost of refurbishment will be \$150,000-00.
